Some scientists suggest that advanced extraterrestrial civilizations might leave technosignatures – traces of their advanced technology – for us to discover. The hunt for such signals and artifacts remains a key focus for those intrigued by the possibility of alien observation.

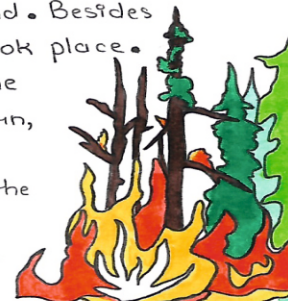

FOREST FIRES IN INDIA

In May 2018, several hectares of forest cover was lost in Uttarakhand due to massive forest fires that took place in this region. As many as 1500 forest fire incidents took away 3500 hectares of forests of Uttarakhand. The Shivalik and Garhwal regions were most affected. Most of these fires were reported to be in the Almora, Uttarkashi, Haridwar and Chamoli regions of Uttarakhand. Besides financial loss, a lot of biodiversity loss took place. Reports suggest that global warming is one of the prime reasons for forest fires. In turn, forest fires lead to a rise in temperature and release of excessive carbon dioxide in the air, leading further to global warming, thus, creating a vicious cycle. Most forest fires, however, are caused due to human negligence, climate change and excessive deforestation. Dried pine needles and dried eucalyptus leaves are rich in oil content and are highly inflammable, facilitating the propagation of forest fires.
